Horse sculpture with mane, Karl Hagenauer, Werkstatte Hagenauer Vienna, ca. 1930, cast brass, marked

Popular works by the Werkstatte Hagenauer Vienna include depictions of horses, which were executed in a wide variety of ways.

The present masterful cast brass work was left as a hollow body, which clearly defines the view side. As if from a spiral, the elegant horse's head rises from the base. The thread-like arrangement of the animal's mane intensifies the expression of dynamic. This movement is continued by the elongated head pointing to the left and the ear also pointing to the left. An arrow-like overall image is created, which encourages the viewer to direct his attention in this given direction. Also the concentrated look of the animal, which is indicated particularly reduced only by two lines, follows this direction.

The directional effect of the sculpture is particularly suitable for a place that is in correspondence with other objects at the place of presentation.
