Wilhelm Nicolaus Prachensky was an Austrian painter, graphic artist, and architect. He studied painting at the Academy of Fine Arts in Munich under Angelo Jank. The versatile artist spent most of his life in Innsbruck, painting landscapes as well as portraits. He is an outstanding representative of Classical Modernism in Tyrol.

Together with others he founded the artists association "Die Waage" and was represented in touring exhibitions in Europe. Wilhelm Nicolaus was the father of the renowned Austrian painter Markus Prachensky.
